Student & faculty focus groups summaries

- <u>Student focus groups</u>: Time management, technology trends (support/training/accessibility/false assumptions on technology knowledge)

<u>Additional data</u>: what percentage of students have their own computers? How many have access to Wi-Fi (may be able to get it from and existing survey – CCSSE)?

Blackboard: how uniform are the course offerings? Ask Jim L. for a percentage of template/format use.

• <u>Faculty focus groups</u>: reading skills and comprehension, attendance (importance), study skills, and lack of preparation for class.

Next steps:

- Reengage the gateway faculty with focus group summaries and ask them to identify themes to inform our direction.
- Jill will email the Principles assessment survey to the College for feedback with a 4/29 return date. The survey mirrors the readiness assessment that we submitted last spring.
- Russ Davis will assist with the Implementation Plan writing. Barb and David encouraged us to share progress drafts with them for feedback.

- Student focus groups: Technology (access, knowledge phone/device vs. computer, technology knowledge coming in the door). More opportunities/methods for alternate learning group projects, small group work, learning that goes beyond the 3 tests during the semester intended to illustrate mastery of the content. Students expressed reading/writing challenges quantity/retention (Jim Maio). College readiness/attendance. Students also expressed that they would appreciate more engaged learning rather than straight lecture and out of the box Power Points.
