

Commercial Driver's License (CDL) TRAINING: FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



What does it cost?

The price of this training is \$5,500, and lasts 160 hours. The class fee includes your study materials, enrollment checks (driving record, drug test, physical examination), and road testing fee (one road test attempt included, two additional attempts are offered at \$40 per test). The NYS fees for your permit and licensing are not included and must be paid directly to the DMV. **Funding may be available for those who qualify.**

When do classes run?

Weekday classes are 4-weeks long, Monday through Thursday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Weekend classes are 8-weekends long, Saturdays and Sundays, from 7:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

Where does training take place?

Weekday classes: Week 1 is held on the Utica MVCC Campus, then weeks 2-4 are conducted on the driving range.

Weekend classes: Weekends 1 & 2 are held on the Utica MVCC Campus, then weekends 3-8 are on the driving range.

The Utica MVCC Campus is located at **1101 Sherman Drive, Utica, NY 13501.**

The Driving Range is located at **4608 NY-233, Clinton, NY 13323.**

How big are the classes?

Classes have a 4:1 student to instructor ratio, for personalized attention every step of the way.

Do I need to know how to drive a stick shift?

Nope! All trucks used in the program are 18-wheelers with automatic transmissions.

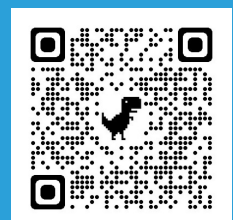

The CDL Training: Class A Tractor Trailer program is 160 hours, available in weekday classes (M-Th) or weekend classes (Sat & Sun). Topics covered include:

- vehicle inspections
- defensive driving
- range maneuvers
- motor carrier safety regulations
- trip planning
- cargo handling
- size / weight laws
- general maintenance procedures
- hours of service
- accident prevention

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Interested students must:

- Have a valid NYS driver's license
- Have a clean driving record; successfully pass a DOT physical & drug screen
- Have the ability to drive safely, regardless of weather or time of day
- Be comfortable operating heavy machinery
- Be a resident of New York State
- Be able to prove your legal presence & show your Social Security card
- Have sufficient ability to read and speak English
- Be 18 or older; students under 21 have additional training requirements
