# What is the SVP?

- ▶ Sexual Violence Prevention Survey
- ▶ SUNY-mandated for ALL SUNY Campuses
  - ▶ 2 “separate but parallel” surveys, one for staff, one for students
- ▶ Part of the action plan of the SUNY Sexual Violence Prevention Task Force
- ▶ Part of Title IX Legislation Compliance
- ▶ Web- based (no real option for paper)



# Who Created the Survey?

- ▶ SUNY created the survey with input from campuses
  - ▶ The survey was piloted by 8 schools in Fall 2016
  - ▶ Adjustments were made, and the production version was released in Spring 2017
    - ▶ The IRB (Institutional Review Boards) had to review and comment, even though no changes were being made at that point
    - ▶ Very graphic questions and answer choices – graphic enough to warrant trigger warnings

# How was it implemented?

- ▶ A private vendor, Campus Labs, hosted the survey for ALL SUNY campuses.
  - ▶ We provided email lists for ALL students over 18 and ALL staff
  - ▶ Campus labs hosted the survey forms, reminder letters, etc.
  - ▶ Goal was to protect respondent privacy




# How was it implemented?

- ▶ Mandated to be open for 3 weeks. Began April 9, ended April 30
- ▶ Large VOLUME of email
  - ▶ 3812 Students
  - ▶ 813 Staff
- ▶ Technical problem with volume of mail hitting our servers all at once



# Return rates

- ▶ Student survey
  - ▶ 408/3812 – a 10.7% return rate
- ▶ Staff Survey
  - ▶ 246/813 – a 30.25% return rate
- ▶ We were not “the worst” in return rates (SUNY Presentation)



# Results

- ▶ How representative?

- ▶ Gender


- ▶ Survey: 64.8% Women/32.2 % Men

- ▶ Actual : Women 54% and Men 46%

- ▶ Ethnicity

- ▶ Survey: 71.9% White


- ▶ Actual: 73.7% White



# Results


- ▶ How representative?
  - ▶ Age
    - ▶ Survey: 43% 18-20
    - ▶ Actual = 36.5% 18-20





# Results

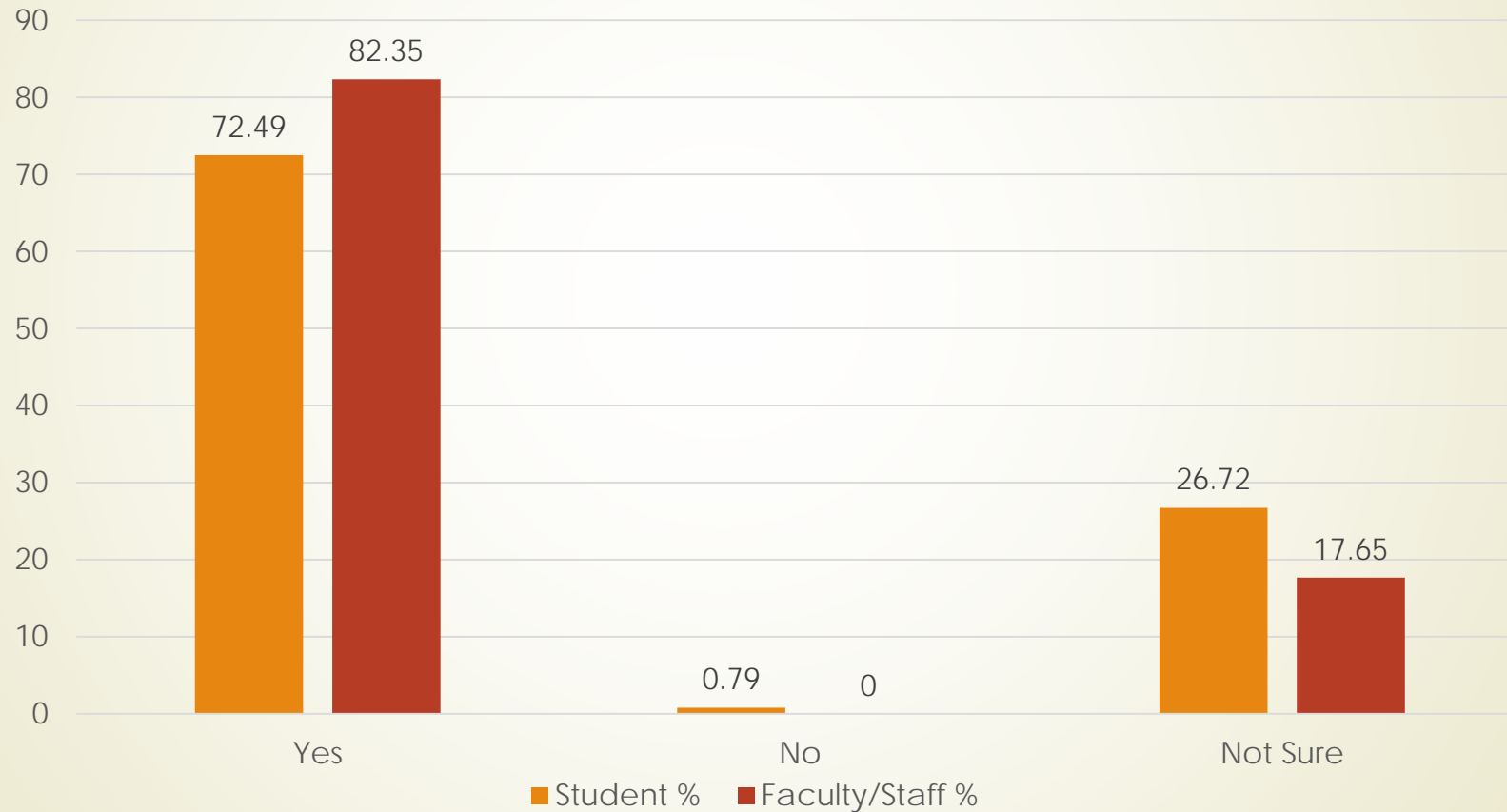
- ▶ This was *not* a random sample
- ▶ Possible sources of bias:
  - ▶ “Self-selection bias” – those who choose to complete the survey *may or may not* be representative of the entire campus population
  - ▶ That applies to both surveys



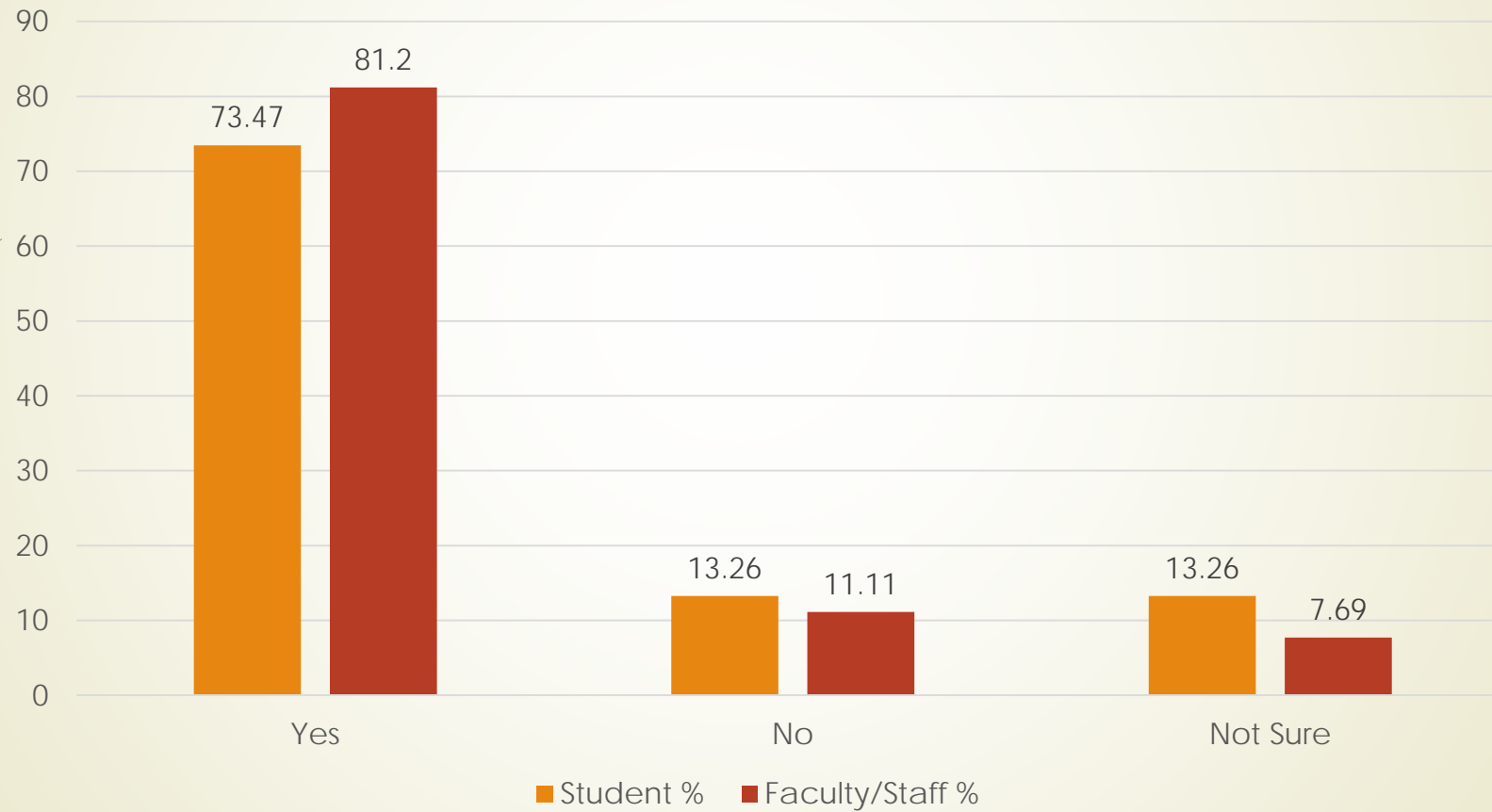
## Some inconsistency in these two questions...

- ▶ Student: During the last year, did any of these things happen?
- ▶ Staff: During they last year, did student disclose that these things happened (they could disclose “in the past year” something that happened “in some year other than in the past year”)

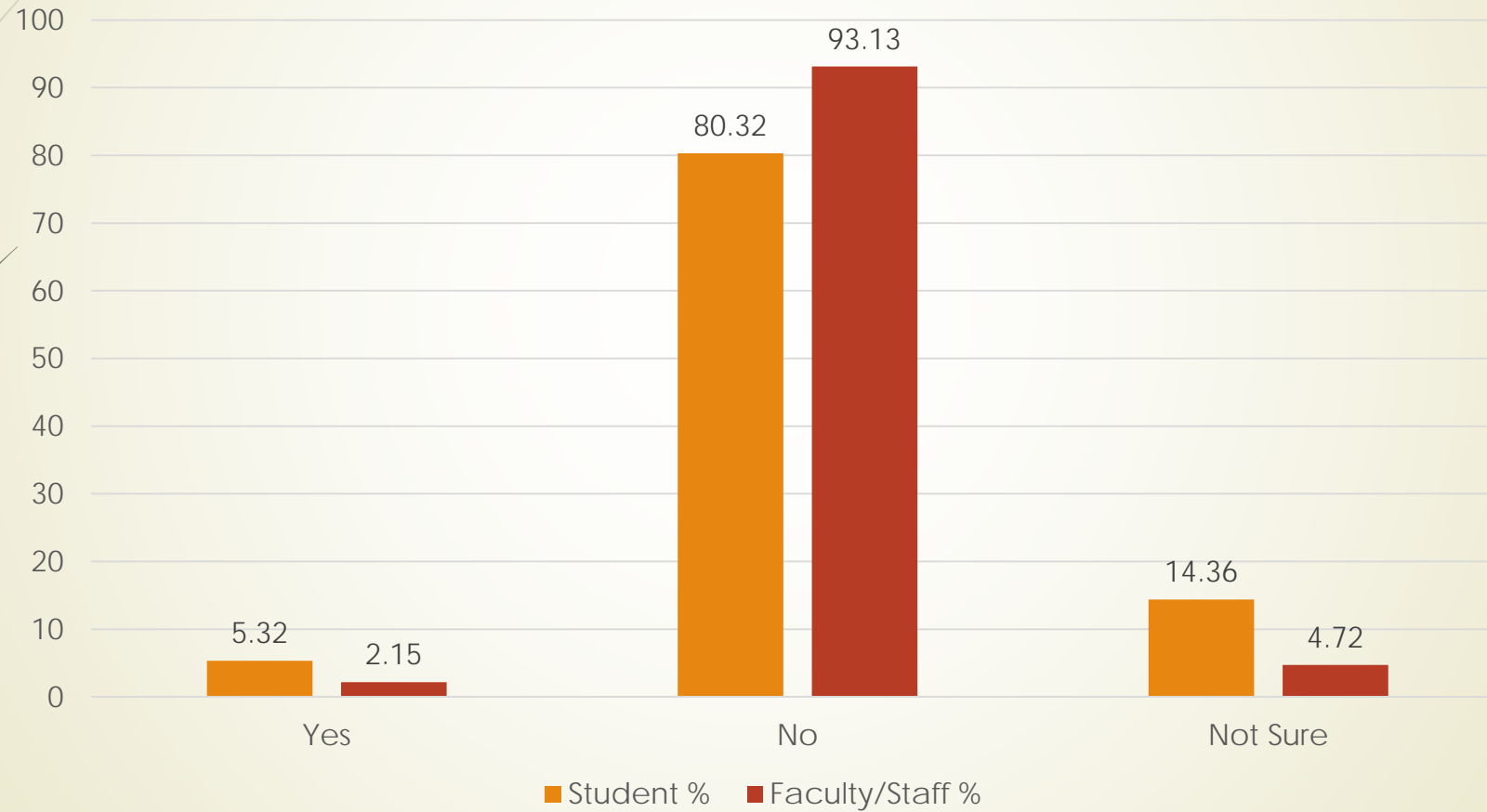

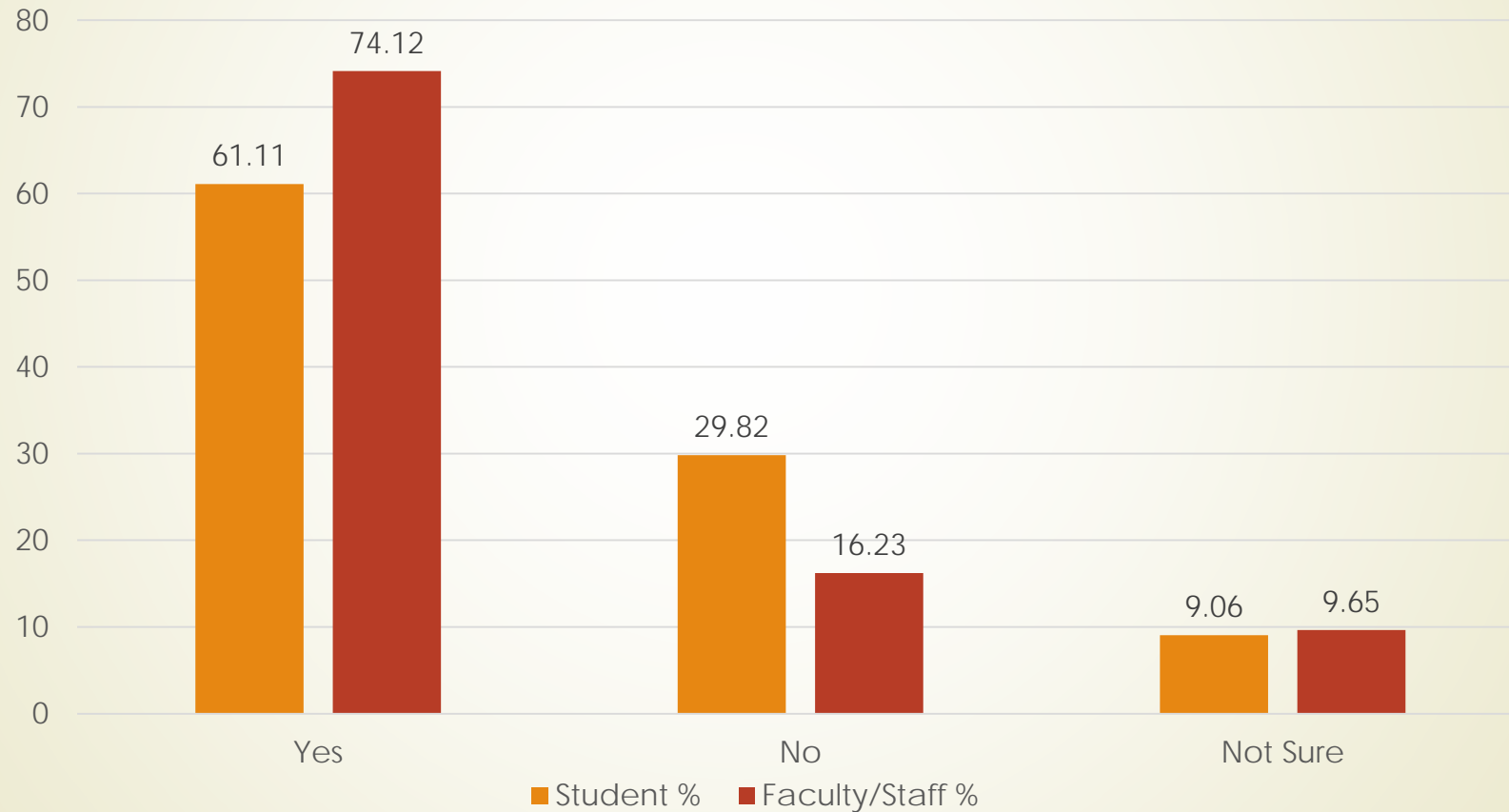
# Affirmative Consent- Do you know the Definition?



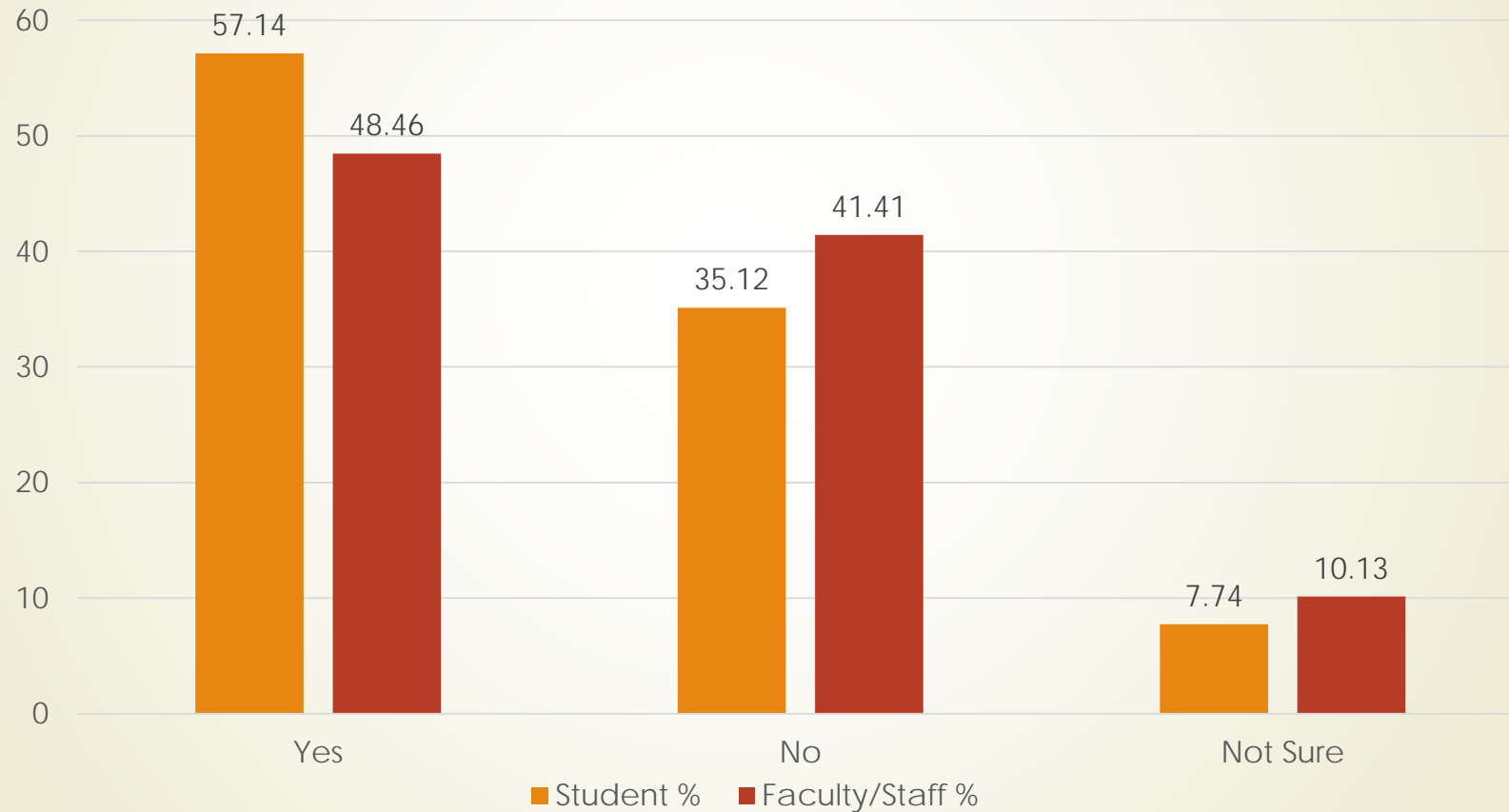
# Affirmative Consent: Can an incapacitated Person Consent?-



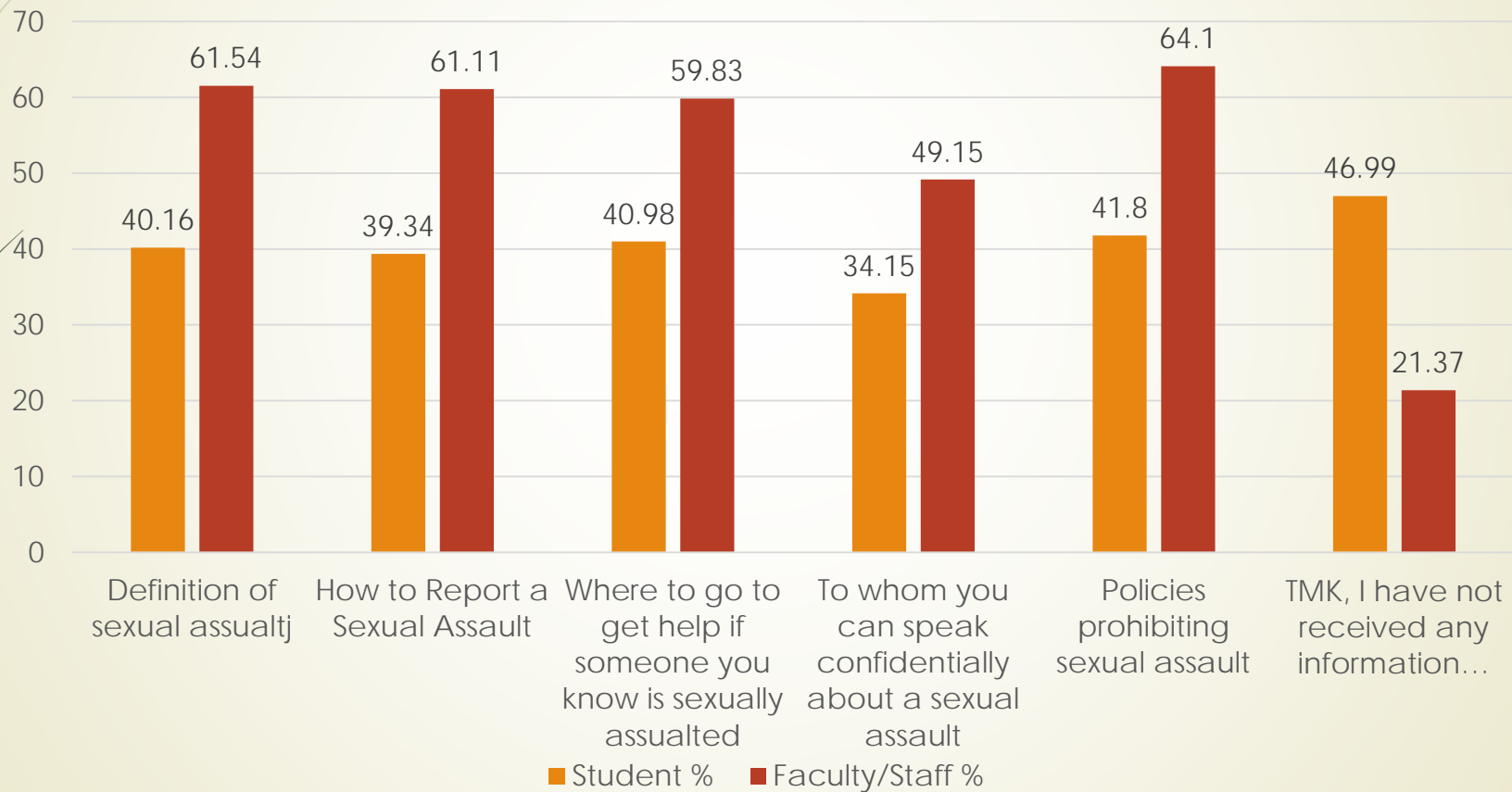
# College Disciplinary Process vs CJ System: Do you know the difference?



# SUNY Drug and Alcohol Amnesty Policy-Were you aware of the policy?

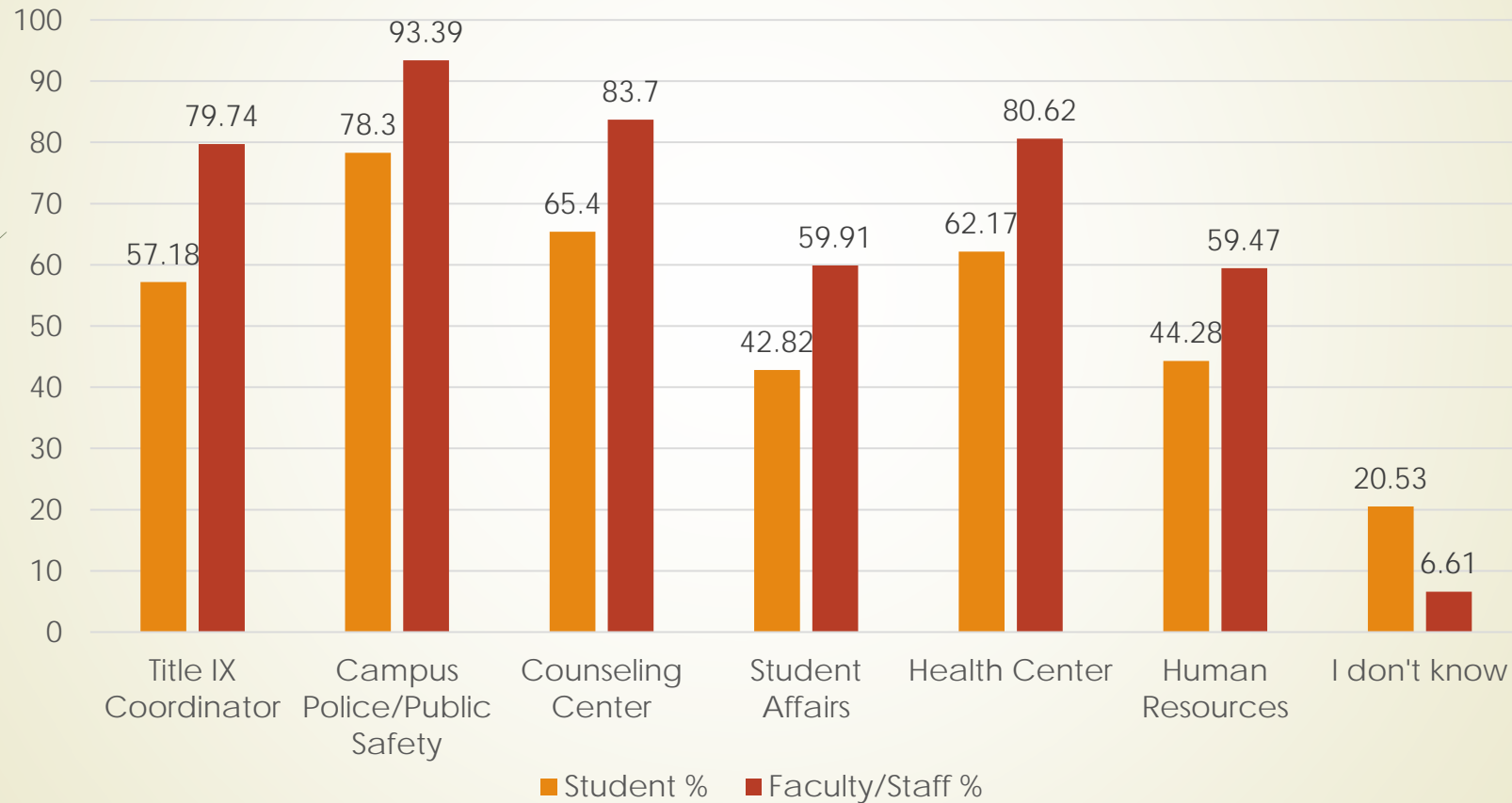


# Have you received verbal/written information on...?

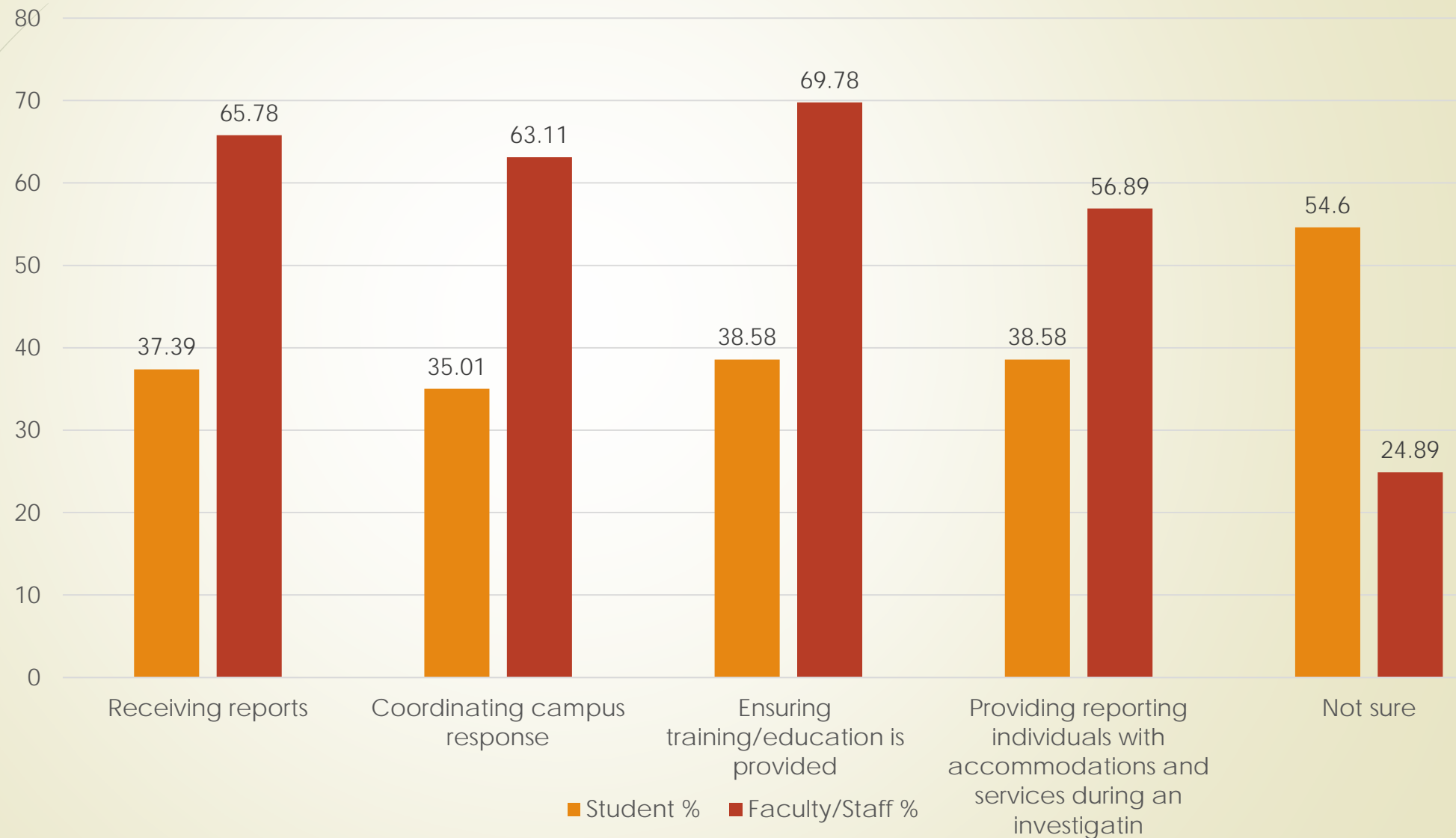




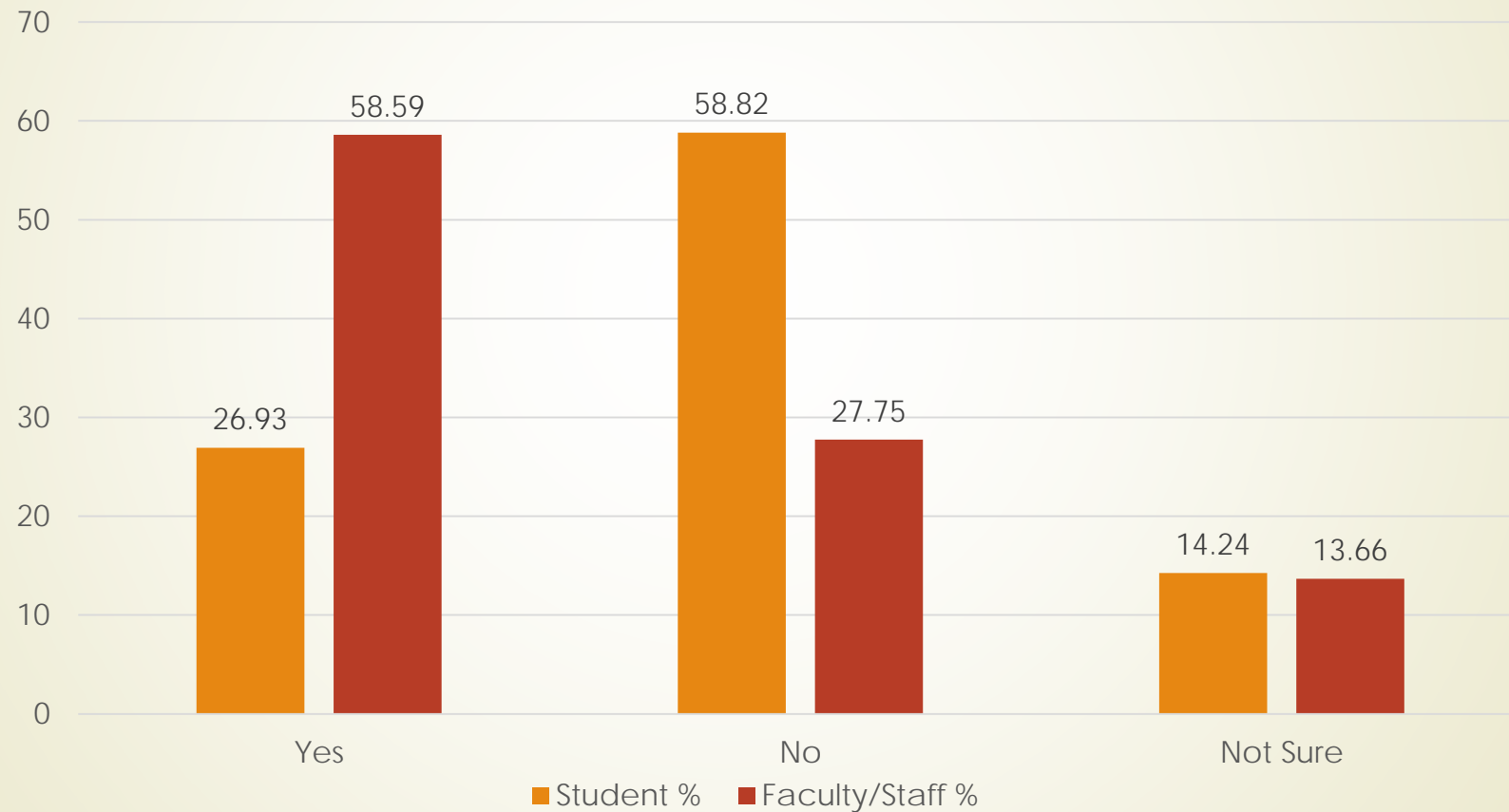
# To whom can a victim/survivor/witness formally disclose?



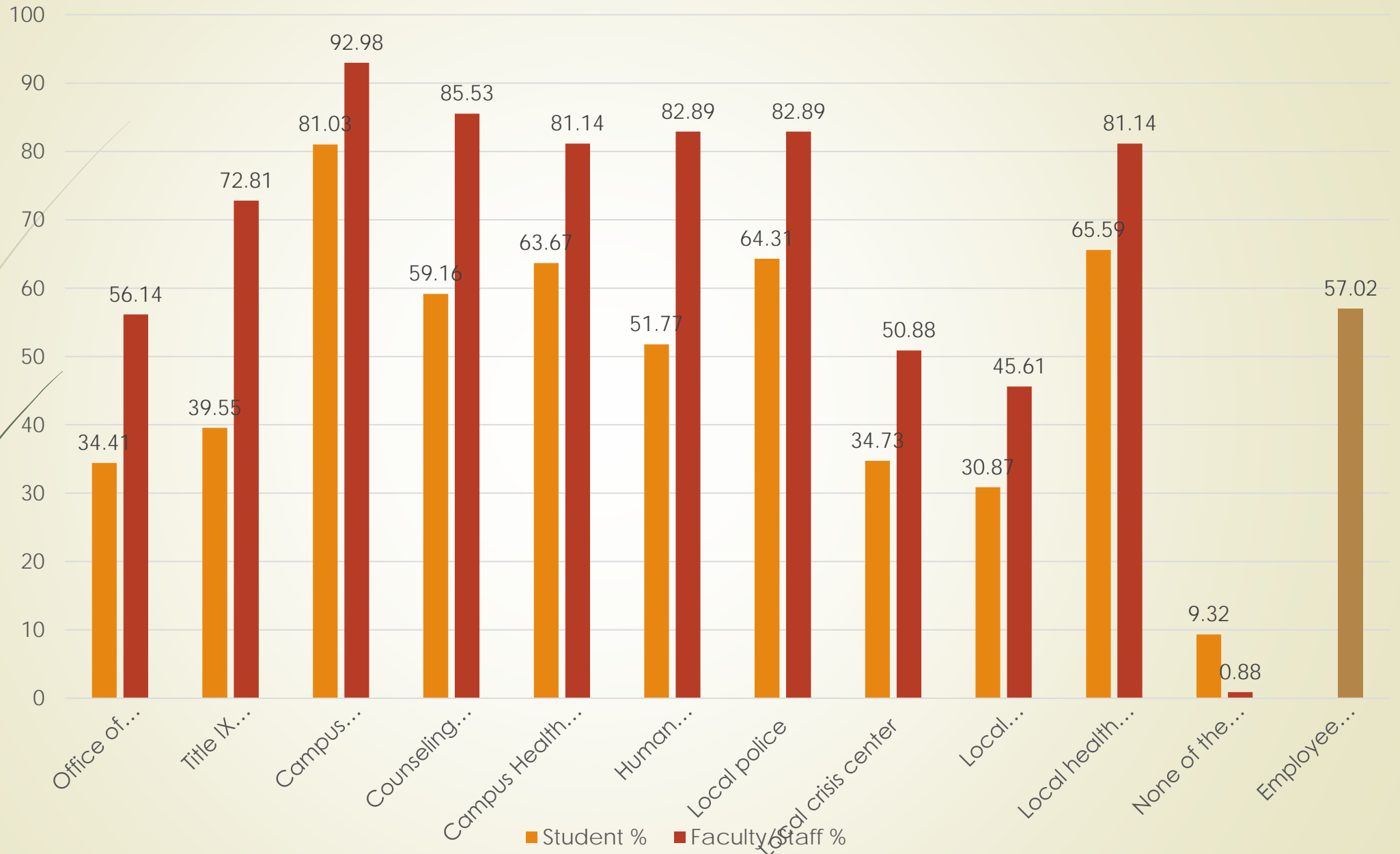
# Which are the roles of the Title IX Coordinator?



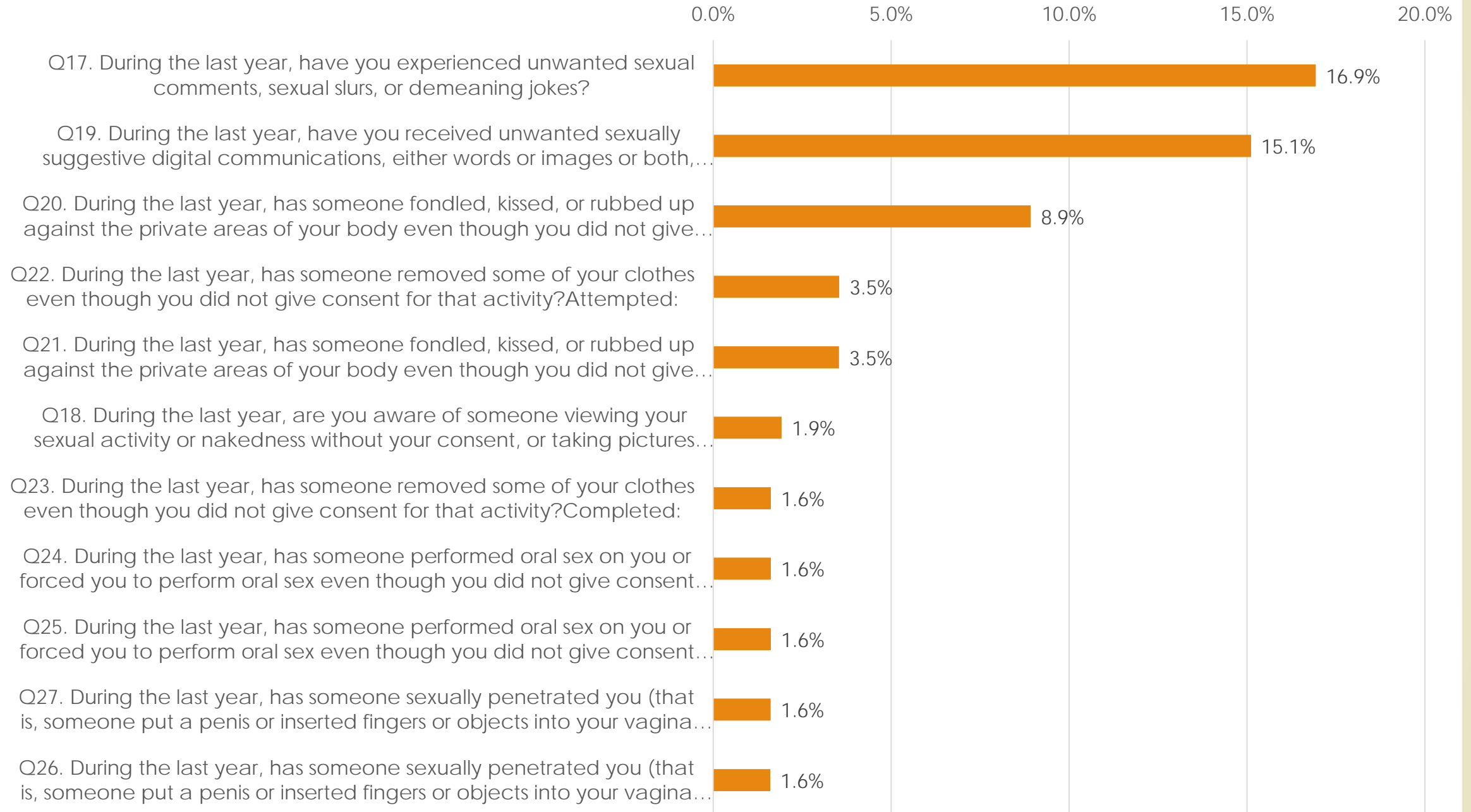
# Do you know how to find the Title IX Coordinator?



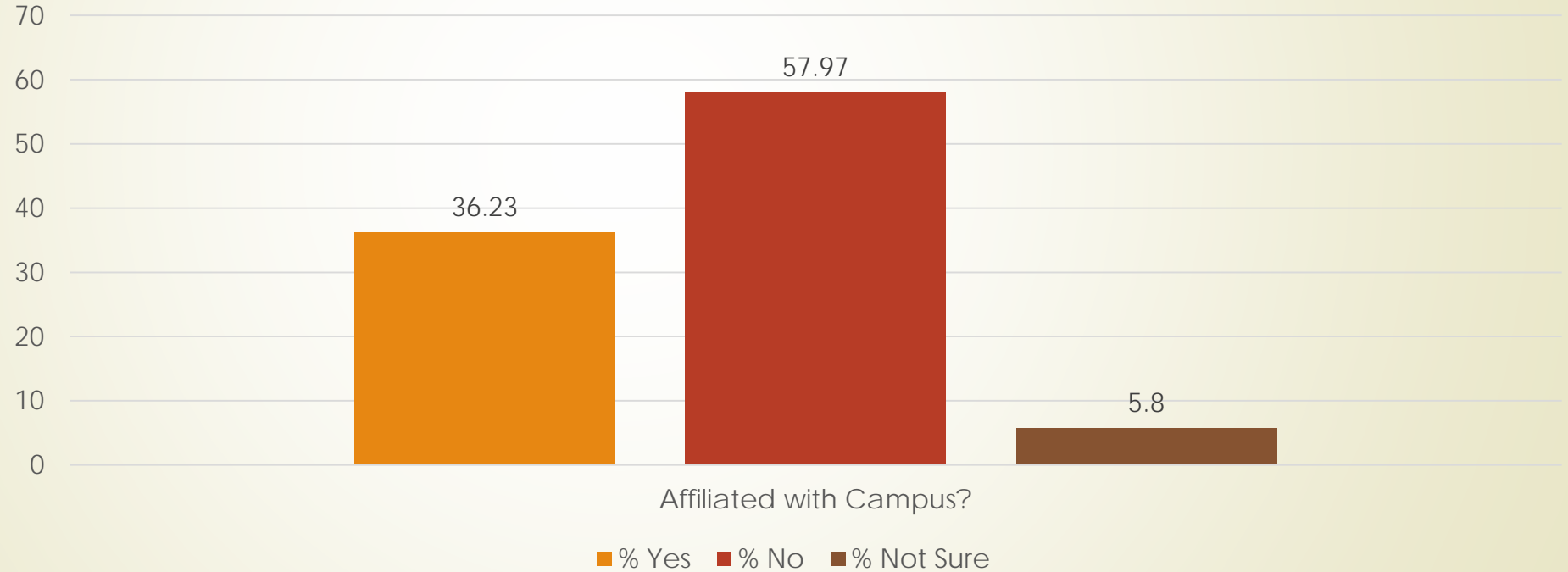
# Availability of Sexual Violence and Interpersonal Resources...



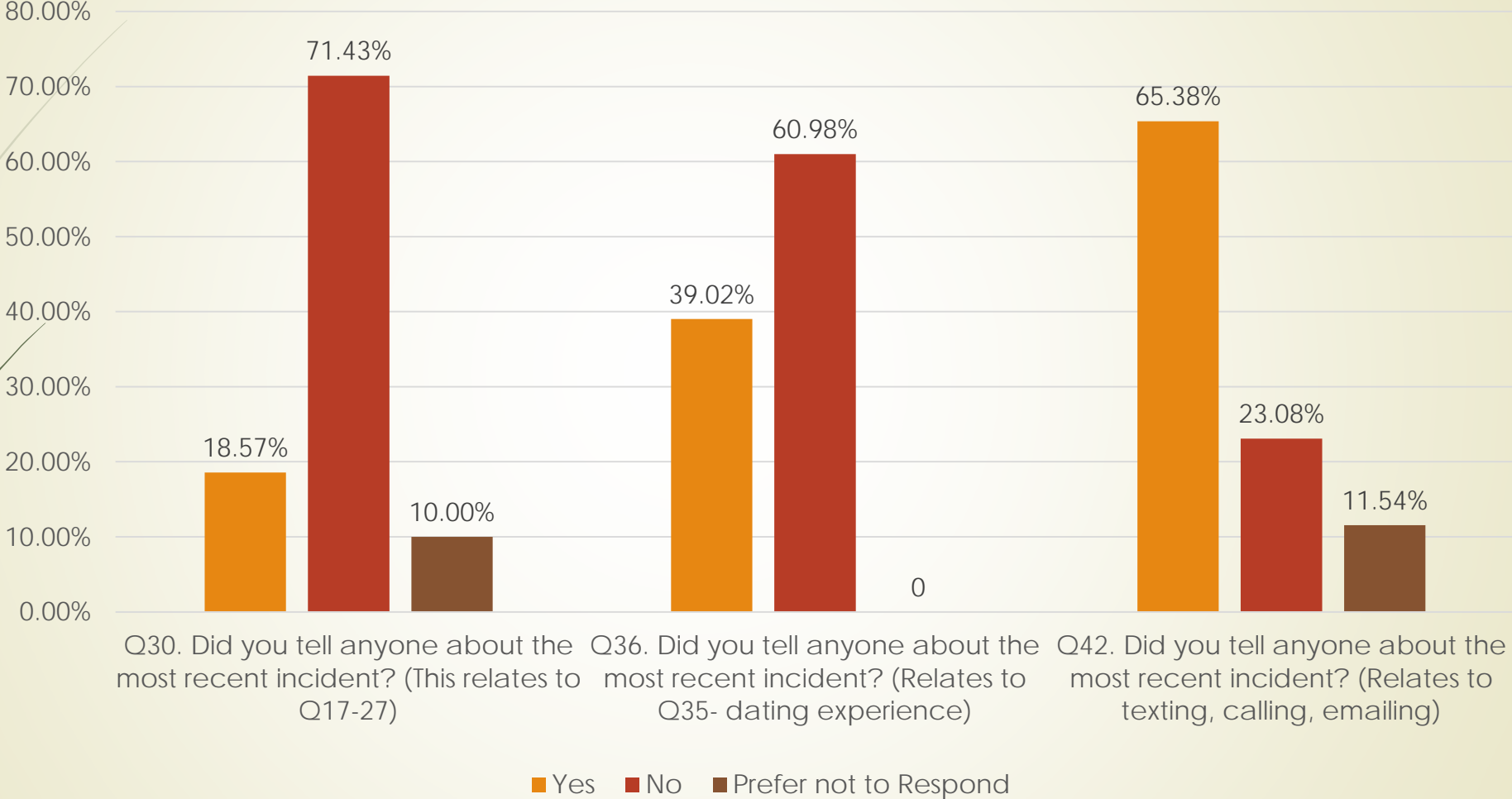
# Summary of "Yes" Student Responses to Q17-Q27

# Did Students Tell Anyone?



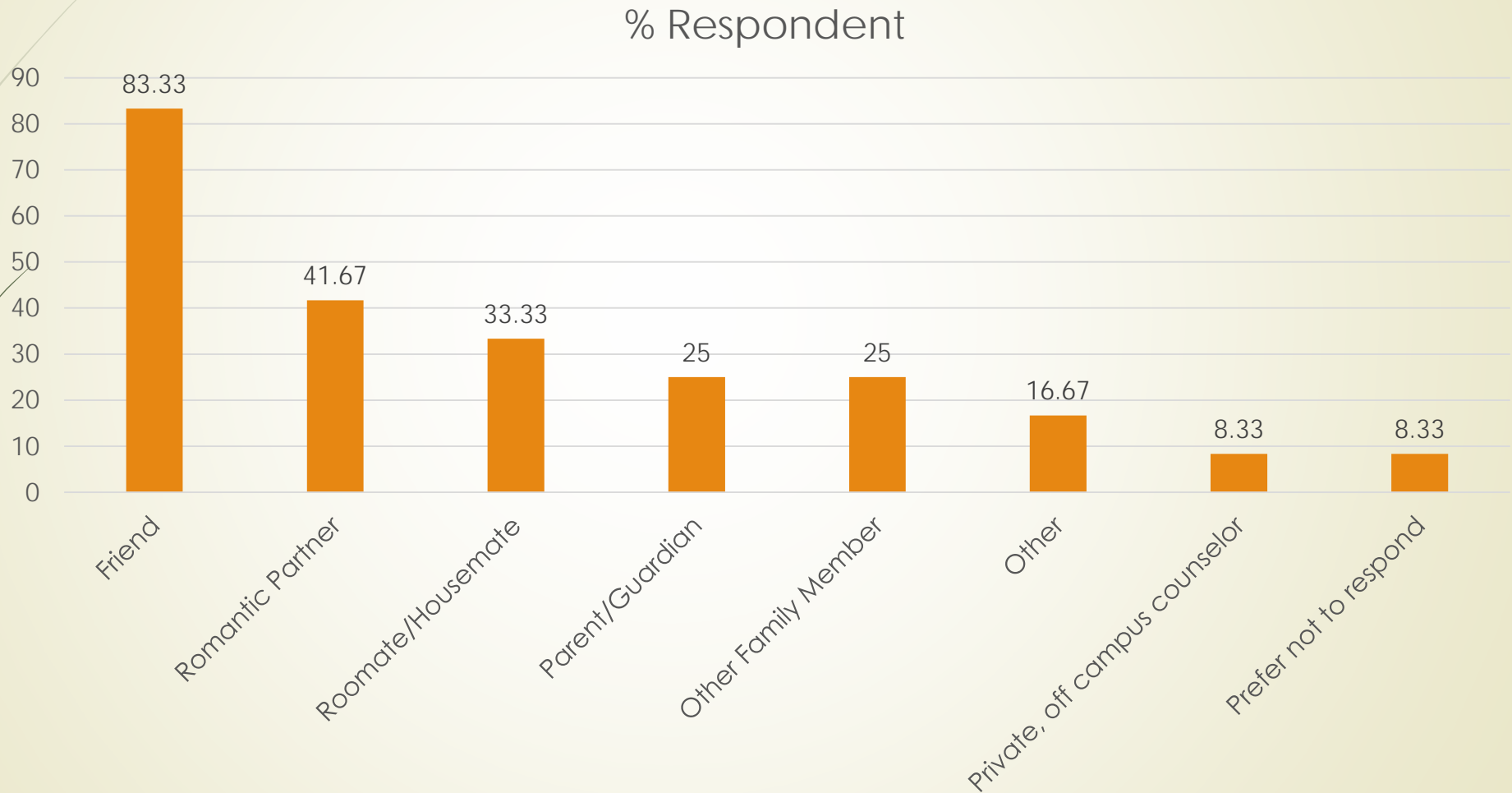


# Themes...

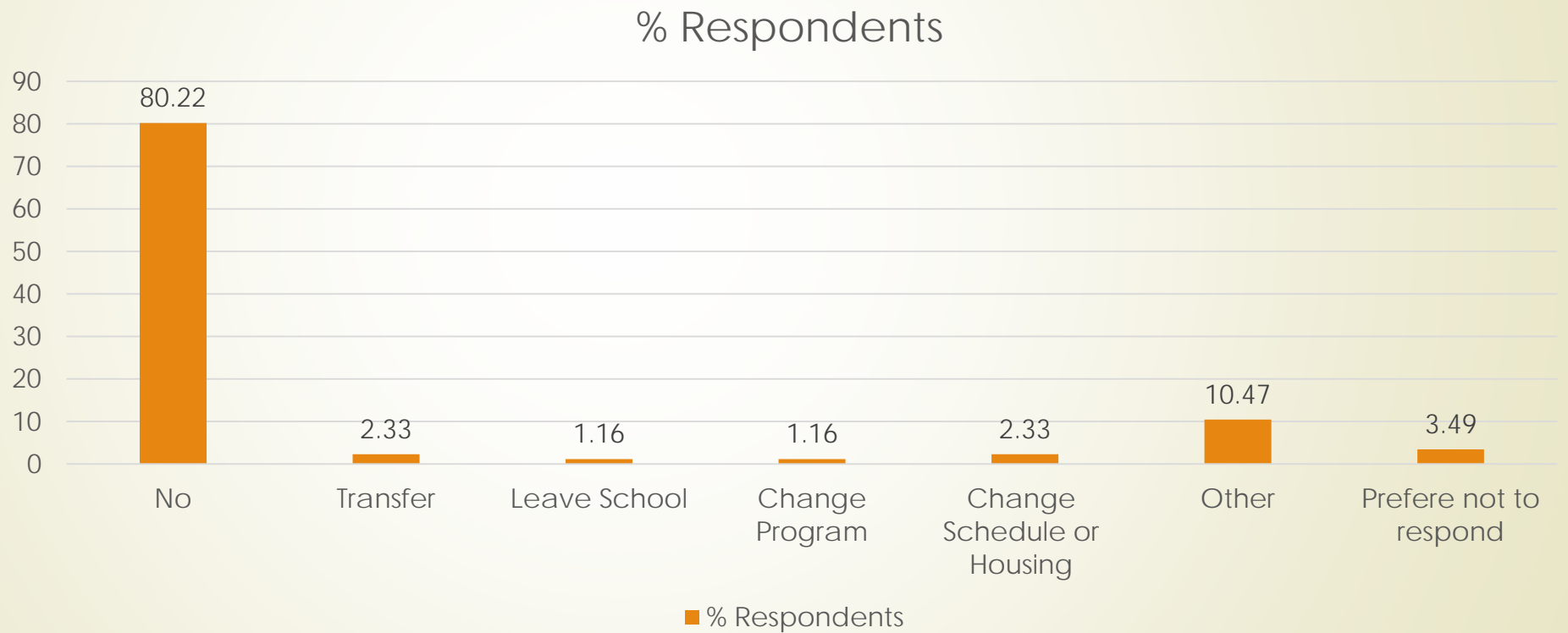
- ▶ I didn't think it was important enough
