## 5. Starfish Survey

The faculty members teaching cohort 1 and cohort 2 Gateway courses completed Progress Survey 2 in Starfish. This survey was used to identify students who are not coming to class consistently. This survey was also used to identify students who don't seem engaged so that the completion coaches can take steps to get them on track and provide study skills support, classroom etiquette training, and support for making up missed assignments.
